# Spokane Chapter Washington Pilots Association 2021 Scholarship Application Flight Training and Aviation Studies



One or more scholarships in the amount of \$2000.00 will be awarded by the Spokane Chapter of the Washington Pilots Association. Successful applicants will be informed by email in March 2021.

Scholarships may be used for flight training, completing academic studies to meet FAA requirements for airframe & powerplant mechanic, Inspection Authorization, avionics technician, academic studies for aircraft dispatcher, or for academic study leading to a degree in an aviation related field of engineering or management.

All scholarship applicants must be currently enrolled in or accepted into an aviation related program that leads to a two year or four year degree, or an advanced degree at any accredited educational institution, or be a flight student in a flight school teaching under FAR Part 141, or be studying with a flight instructor who teaches under FAR Part 61.

### To be eligible an applicant must meet the following criteria:

• If a flight student, and actively engaged in flight training with an appropriate flight instructor when training is under FAR Part 61, he or she must be showing satisfactory progress. Or, be enrolled and in good standing in a flight training program under FAR Part 141. Or be enrolled and accepted into an aviation training or educational program at an academic institution located in the Inland Empire that will result in a two, four year, or advanced degree in a field of study that will prepare the applicant for a career in aviation.

#### To be eligible for an Academic or A&P Scholarship

- If a student at an academic institution enrolled in a course leading to an aviation related two or four year degree, or an aviation related maintenance technician or dispatch certificate, be enrolled full time, and demonstrate satisfactory academic progress toward completing the course of study.
- Be enrolled and accepted into an aviation training or educational program at an academic institution located in the Inland Empire that will result in a two, four year, or advanced degree in a field of study that will prepare the applicant for a career in aviation

#### Instructions and additional criteria:

- 1. All Applicants must be residents of the Inland Empire
- 2. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
- 3. Materials submitted to the Washington Pilots Association with your application will not be returned.
- 4. The applicant must complete Sections A, B, and C. **No hand written applications will be accepted.** A representative of the applicant's school, or CFI if studying under FAR Part 61, must complete the box at the beginning of Section A, certifying that the applicant is enrolled and in good standing.
- 5. If applying for a flight training scholarship attach a photocopy of your current pilot certificate, current medical and logbook page(s) showing your total hours with the last date flown, endorsements/currency and a copy of your written test results if any, for the certification desired.
- 6. Include two letters of reference. One letter must be from a personal reference and the other from someone working in the aviation industry that knows you.
- 7. The applicant must submit a type written statement that outlines personal goals, how training will be used, and a description of financial need. Also describe what has drawn you to aviation. Your statement must be no longer than one page.
- 8. Applications and supporting materials must be in one envelope, received on or before February 28, 2021.

- 9. The scholarship will be awarded in March, 2021.
- 10. Acceptance of the scholarship constitutes permission for the Washington Pilots Association to use their name and photograph.
- 11. Funds will be paid directly to the educational institution, flight school, FBO, or instructor to be applied toward flight training or tuition at a college, university, or trade school. Please have a representative from your school or your Flight Instructor sign below, certifying that funds will only be applied to flight training or academic tuition costs.
